# 7 Basic Ways To Celebrate Vocation Awareness Week

#### **Preach on Vocations**

Consider a special homily aimed primarily at young people. Stress that happiness is found in God's will alone.

## **Visibly Promote Vocations**

Place posters or banners in the narthex and parish hall.

#### **Bulletin**

Include a strong vocations message.

#### **Catholic School**

Plan a special week with the principal. Include an art or essay contest, and visits from sisters, priests, or seminarians (via Skype), if possible.

#### **Religious Education**

Work with your DRE to ensure catechists know in advance so they can plan special lessons on vocations.

#### **Youth Ministry**

Make sure the Youth Minister has a vocations-themed meeting planned. Ideas: Q&A w/ priests or religious sisters | Vocations movie night (list: dsj.org/Vocations) | Holy Hour for Vocations | CALLED by Ydisciple on FORMED.org

#### **Young Adults**

Invite a priest to your young adult group to tell his story and talk about discernment. Don't dumb it down! Be sure to offer good, in-depth information about discernment.
