



LETTER FROM BISHOP OSCAR CANTÚ

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

The Diocese of San José is blessed. We are most blessed to have been given an auxiliary bishop to help in pastoring our diverse and gifted diocese. We give thanks to God today for the election of Bishop Andy Ligot to serve the Diocese of San José as Auxiliary Bishop. We are most grateful to Pope Leo XVI for appointing Bishop Andy to continue to serve among us, in a new and expanded capacity.

This is indeed a time of celebration among us. Over the past four or five years our diocese has embarked on a synodal journey, convoking our first ever diocesan synod, creating a pastoral plan to guide our pastoral and administrative efforts over the next several years, and have begun in earnest to implement the plan and raise seed funding for this increased, focused activity in our Church.

In 2031 the Diocese of San José celebrates its 50th anniversary. This coincides with the 500th anniversary of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the patroness (together with Saint Joseph) that we have adopted to help guide our pastoral plan. Two years later, in 2033, the universal Church will celebrate the 2000 years since the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Durante los últimos cuatro o cinco años, nuestra diócesis ha emprendido un sinodal. convocando camino nuestro primer sínodo diocesano, creando un plan pastoral para quiar nuestros esfuerzos pastorales y administrativos durante los próximos años, y hemos comen-zado seriamente a implementar el plan y a recaudar fondos iniciales para esta actividad más intensa y enfocada en nuestra Iglesia.

En 2031, la Diócesis de San José celebra su 50º aniversario. Esto coincide con el 500º aniversario de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, patrona (junto con San José) que hemos adoptado para guiar nuestro plan pastoral. Dos años después, en 2033, la Iglesia universal celebrará los 2000 años de la muerte y resurrección de Jesucristo.





THE SYMBOLS A BISHOP WEARS AND WHY

Ordination day looks beautiful from the pews: the vestments, the music, prayers and the ritual. Look closer and you'll notice a handful of simple things the Church places on a new bishop. They're not props. They hint at how a bishop lives his ministry among us here in Santa Clara Valley.

Miter




The tall, two-peaked headdress is worn when a bishop presides and set aside for prayer in humility. The two "shields" and trailing fabric strips (lappets) are traditionally linked to the Old and New Testaments. A reminder that the bishop teaches with the light of God's Word and the fire of the Holy Spirit. In the liturgy, the miter quietly signals responsibility under the Word he proclaims.

Episcopal Ring



Given during the rite, the ring signifies a covenant bond with the local Church, enduring fidelity to the Gospel and a lifelong "yes" to the people entrusted to the bishop's care. Like a wedding band, it points to steadfast love and responsibility to guard the Church's faith. Many bishops wear the ring daily as a quiet, tangible promise kept.

Crozier (pastoral staff)





Pectoral Cross




Worn close to the heart, the pectoral cross keeps the Paschal Mystery at the center of episcopal life. Traditionally suspended from a silk cord at liturgy (and a chain with clerical dress), some crosses include an amethyst long associated with bishops. The message is simple and demanding: leadership in the Church flows from the Cross, not from privilege.

Zucchetto (skullcap)



The purple zucchetto signifies episcopal consecration and communion with the college of bishops. It is removed at moments of solemn prayer, especially during the Eucharistic Prayer, to express reverence before the Lord's presence. Color denotes rank in the Church's family: white for the pope, red for cardinals, purple for bishops.

Put together, these five signs sketch a picture of a bishop: teacher under the Word, shepherd with others, faithful to his people, anchored at the Cross, prayerful before the Lord.

A VISUAL MISSION BISHOP ANDRES' EPISCOPAL COAT OF ARMS AND MOTTO







Bishop Andres C. Ligot' coat of arms tells a story before a single word is spoken. Its blue and white colors echo two homes of the heart-the Philippines and the United States-signaling the journey that formed him and the community he now serves as Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of San José.

At the center, two red bars arranged as a cross (a saltire) honor Saint Andrew the Apostle-Bishop Andres's namesake. The placement isn't ornamental; it points to a life patterned on the Apostle's readiness to bring people to Christ. In the upper left (dexter chief) a gold carpenter's square evokes Saint Joseph, patron of our diocese: steady, faithful, and practical in love. It's a quiet nod to the place where Bishop Andres was ordained a priest and now returns as a bishop to serve.

On the opposite side, a gold flaming heart pierced by an arrow recalls Saint Augustine's burning love for Godrestless until it rests in Him-and, fittingly, the Augustinian family. Pope Leo XIV, an Augustinian, appointed Bishop Andres; the heart acknowledges that spiritual lineage. The flames also speak to Bishop Andres's formation in canon law-law set ablaze by charity, not cooled by legalism.


Three white roses complete the shield. They honor Mary under titles close to his heart: Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Immaculate Conception, and Our Lady, Cause of Our Joy. Each rose is a petition in bloom-protection for the vulnerable, purity of intention, joy in the Gospel.

Above the shield sits the full episcopal "achievement": the green hat (galero) with six tassels on each side, the sign of the episcopal rank; the processional cross rising behind the shield, reminding us that a bishop leads from the Cross; and, beneath, the scroll bearing his motto: Lex Christi Caritas Est—"The law of Christ is love."

That line, drawn from the spirit of Galatians 5:14, guides the whole design. For Bishop Ligot, law is the servant of communion. Rules exist to safeguard the dignity of the person, protect the weak, and keep the Church moving together toward Christ. In practice, the motto becomes a pastoral method: listen before speaking, tell the truth with mercy, choose service over status.

Taken together, arms and motto offer a simple compass for his ministry in Santa Clara Valley: rooted in Mary's care, measured by Joseph's fidelity, fired by Augustine's love, and always under the rule of Christ's charity.



BIOGRAPHY







Bishop-elect Andres "Andy" C. Ligot serves the Diocese of San José as Vicar General/Chancellor and Pastor of Saint Elizabeth of Portugal Parish in Milpitas. On August 29, 2025, Pope Leo XIV appointed him Auxiliary Bishop of San José, recognizing a priestly ministry marked by pastoral care, juridical expertise, and quiet fidelity to the people of God.

Born on November 30, 1965, in Laoag City, Philippines, to Ismael Ligot and Eulalia Cantoria, he was baptized in January 1966 at Saint Andrew Catholic Church in Bacarrá, Ilocos Norte. His formation began close to home—St. Mary's Seminary (Laoag) for high school and San Pablo College Seminary (Baguio), where he earned a B.A. in Philosophy and a minor in Sociology (1986).

Bishop-elect Ligot taught Philosophy at the Manila Central University in Manila before entering San José Seminary at the Ateneo de Manila University for his first two years of theological studies. He was later sent to Pamplona, Spain, to attend the Colegio Eclesiastico Internacional Bidasoa, an International Seminary, where he completed his seminary formation in 1992. He finished all academic units in the M.A. in Philosophy program (1988) at the University of Santo Tomas (Manila).

On June 14, 1992, he was ordained a priest at Saint Peter's Basilica by Pope Saint John Paul II for the Diocese of Laoag in the Philippines. Bishop-elect Ligot's assignments after ordination in the Philippines, included parochial vicar at Saint Andrew Parish in Bacarra Ilocos Norte, parochial vicar at Saint William Cathedral in Laoag City, director of the Diocese of Laoag's Commission on Christian Education, and the national coordinator for "Evangelization 2000" — a universal church project aimed to rejuvenate and spread the Christian faith in anticipation of the third millennium. He was also the director of the national office for the Catholic School of Evangelization for Asia in Manila




From 1995 to 1999, he served as director of the Casa Sacerdotal Padre Baraee and chaplain of the University Medical Center at the University of Navarra in Pamplona, Spain. He holds an M.A. in Sacred Theology (1992), a Licentiate in Canon Law (JCL) (1997), and a Doctorate in Canon Law (JCD) (1999) from the University of Navarra in Pamplona, Spain.

After completing his doctorate, Bishop-elect Ligot came to the United States in the summer of 1999, where he served at the Church of Nativity in Menlo Park and a chaplain at the Veterans Medical Center in San Francisco. Bishop Patrick McGrath asked him to work at the Tribunal first as Defender of the Bond and later as Judge. After three years in the Tribunal, he was assigned as Parochial Vicar at Saint John Vianney Parish from 2003 to 2005. He was incardinated into the Diocese of San José on March 30, 2004.

His diocesan assignments included: Parochial Vicar at Saint John Vianney (2003–2005); Pastor at Saint Lawrence the Martyr (2005–2009); Judicial Vicar (2008–2021); Pastor at Saint Elizabeth of Portugal (2021–present); and Vicar General/Chancellor (2023–present). He ministers in English, Spanish, Tagalog, and Ilocano.

Away from the tribunal bench and the parish, Bishop-elect Ligot is known for his love of travel and for organizing pilgrimages—especially across Europe—with friends and parishioners. One day, he hopes to make a long road trip across the United States to visit national parks and monuments—a pastor's vacation with a teacher's curiosity.
























ONE VISION, MANY HANDS How an Auxiliary Helps the Church Flourish

In the Catholic Church, an auxiliary bishop is given to a diocese to help the diocesan bishop—the "ordinary"— pastor the people of God. The mission is simple and demanding: share the shepherd's work so the Gospel can take deeper root in every parish, school, and ministry.

An auxiliary bishop is ordained a bishop and serves in full communion with the ordinary. He preaches, celebrates the sacraments, and is often entrusted with confirmations, parish visits, and special pastoral projects. He may oversee a region of the diocese or specific priorities—clergy support, Catholic education, Hispanic ministry, or youth and young adults—so that care for the faithful is personal, timely, and consistent.

What distinguishes the auxiliary from the ordinary is governance. The ordinary holds the cathedra in the cathedral church and bears full responsibility for teaching, sanctifying, and governing the local Church. He sets the diocesan vision, makes final decisions, and is the principal sign of unity. The auxiliary assists the ordinary in all of his delegated tasks. He does not lead the diocese in his own name, nor does he automatically succeed the ordinary; rather, he serves as a close collaborator and trusted partner, promising respect and obedience to the diocesan bishop.

Practically, this collaboration looks like teamwork. While the ordinary convenes and directs the broader pastoral plan—here in the Diocese of San José, "Renewed in Christ, Together in Mission"—the auxiliary helps that plan land: accompanying pastors, strengthening ministries, confirming young people, listening to communities, and supporting formation. In a fast-moving region like the Santa Clara Valley, the auxiliary's presence ensures the bishop's care reaches farther and more frequently.

Put simply, the ordinary is the chief shepherd of the diocese; the auxiliary is a brother shepherd who extends that care. Together, they invite our local Church into deeper communion with Christ and more generous service to our neighbors.

BISHOPS OF SAN JOSÉ







Founding Bishop Pierre DuMaine

Founding Bishop of San José (1981-1999)

Appointed on January 27, 1981, Bishop Pierre DuMaine led the newly created Diocese of San José through its formative years, establishing the essential structures, offices, and ministries needed to serve a rapidly growing Catholic community in Silicon Valley. Previously an Auxiliary Bishop of San Francisco, he brought a pastor's heart and a teacher's mind, contributing nationally to conversations on science, culture, and faith. He guided parish development, supported Catholic education, and fostered lay leadership. Bishop DuMaine retired in 1999 and died on June 13, 2019.



Bishop Emeritus Patrick J. McGrath

Bishop of San José (1999-2019); Coadjutor (1998-1999)

Born in Dublin, Ireland, Patrick Joseph McGrath was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of San Francisco in 1970, earned a doctorate in canon law in 1977, and served as Auxiliary Bishop of San Francisco from 1989 to 1998 before being named Coadjutor and then Bishop of San José. His two decades of leadership emphasized Catholic education, stewardship, parish vitality, and collaborative ministry across a diverse local church. He retired in 2019 and died on May 7, 2023, remembered for steady pastoral care and a welcoming spirit.



Bishop Thomas A. Daly

Auxiliary Bishop of San José (2011-2015)


A Bay Area native and priest of the Archdiocese of San Francisco, Bishop Thomas Anthony Daly was ordained in 1987 and served as parish pastor, archdiocesan vocations director, and president of Marin Catholic High School before his episcopal ministry. Appointed Auxiliary Bishop of San José in 2011, he assisted the diocese with confirmations, priestly support, Catholic schools, and seminary formation during a period of rapid regional growth. In 2015 he was appointed the seventh Bishop of Spokane, where he continues to emphasize evangelization, vocations, Catholic education, and parish life.



Bishop Oscar Cantú

Bishop of San José (2019-present); Coadjutor (2018-2019)

Bishop Oscar Cantú became the third Bishop of San José on May 1, 2019, after service as Coadjutor beginning in 2018. A native of Houston, he was ordained in 1994, served as Auxiliary Bishop of San Antonio (2008-2013), and then as Bishop of Las Cruces (2013-2018). In San José he has focused on spiritual renewal, evangelization, the Eucharist, and outreach to families, youth, and young adults, while contributing nationally through leadership in Hispanic ministry and statewide through service with the California Catholic Conference.






